40.00	Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
80.26	Intersect N. and S. line at the cor. to secs. 16, 17, 20, and 21.
	Thence I run
	S.89*47'W. on a true line bet. secs. 17 and 20.
	Ascend steep slope of ridge.
10.00	Summit of ridge, 200 ft. above cor. bears NE. and SW. Descend.
15.00	Dry gulch, 75 ft. below ridge, course N; ascend.
27.00	Summit of spur, 150 ft. above gulch, bears N.
40.13	Set cedar post, 3ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on N. face, from which A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N.43'E., 65 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.40'W., 77 lks. dist.. No green trees on S. side of line within limit. Dig pit 18x18x12 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ ft. W. of post.
54.00	A cedar, 30 ins. diam. on line marked with 2 notches on E. and W. sides.
56.50	Summit of spur, 75 ft. above $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. Over nearly level ground.
80.26	The cor. to secs. 17, 18, 19, and 20. Land, mountainous. Soil, 4th rate. Timber, fir, and hemlock, all dead except 3 chs. on W. end of line. Undergrowth of laurel, balm, chinquapin, and myrtle. Mountainous land or covered with dense undergrowth.
