20.00 A stream, 6 lks. wide, course NW.

40.00 Set a cedar post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N. face, from which

A hemlock, 30 ins. diam., bears S.67*E., 100 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A cedar, 30 ins. diam., bears N.56*E., 64 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

42.00 Summit of ridge, 125 ft. above branch, bears N. and S. Descend.

47.00 A creek, 10 lks. wide, course NW. 125 ft. below ridge. Over level ground.

54.00 Small branch, course NW. Ascend.

71.00 Summit of ridge, 300 ft. above branch, bears N. and S.

74.00 Spring branch, course NE.

78.50 Stream, 6 lks. wide, course NW. 150 ft. below last stream.

80.00 The cor. to secs. 7, 8, 17, and 18.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, 3rd rate.

Heavily timbered, with fir, hemlock, and cedar.

Undergrowth of willow, fir, hemlock, and rhododendron.

Mountainous land or covered with dense undergrowth, for 80.00 chs.

No lat. taken this day. Cloudy and smoky sky together with dense foliage.

14.00 Branch, 6 lks. wide, course NE. 200 ft. below cor.

26.00 Fir, 24 ins. diam. on line. I mark with 2 notches on N. and S. sides.

29.00 Summit of ridge, 400 ft. above branch, bears NE.
