CHAINS

This Tp. lies West of the Coast Range Mountains, with the exception of secs. 1 and 2 and a part of secs. 12 and 13, which lie upon the waters of the Umqua River. There is Stone Coal in sec. 1, of a very good quality, near the center of the NE. $\frac{1}{4}$.

Plenty of fine building stone, is found in many places along the streams in the North part of the Tp.

The forest fires have destroyed the greater part of the timber, through the central part of the Tp. from the NE. to the SW. cor. and its place is taken by dense undergrowth of young timber. Poison laurel, mountain myrtle, willow, and vinemaple.

The Callahan Trail extends along a divide of 2nd rate land, where many good ranches could be located; it passes through the South tier of sections and its final termination is at tide water, on Coos River, in Range 11 W.

Corrections of Surveys in T. 26 S., R. 8 W.
Same Deputy and Contract.

In the correction of surveys executed under my Contract No. 656 dated May 21, 1896 as ordered by the Commissioner of the General Land Office under date of March 18, 1898. I call to my assistance, Edwin C. Patterson, Crawford P. Lewis and Robert P. Heydon, and after carefully testing my instrument on the Meridian established at Roseburg in 1896 by a corps of United States Topographical Engineers and finding it in proper adjustment, I proceed to the field.

Corrections commenced May 25 1898.

From the Cor. of Secs. 1, 2, 35 and 36 on the South boundary of T 26 S R 8 W. which I find in accordance with original notes. I trace without measuring the surveyed lines and examine each Cor. on the W. and N.
