69.92 Brook, 8 lks. wide, runs NE and ascend

80.00 Set hemlock post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 2, 3, 34 and 35, marked T. 26 S, S 35 on NE, R. 9 W, S 2 on SE, T. 27 S, S 3 on SW, and S 34, on NW faces, with 2 notches on E and 4 notches on W edges, from which

A fir, 22 ins, diam., bears N.75°E., 30 lks. dist., marked T. 26 S, R. 9 W, S 35, B.T.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.16°E., 18 lks. dist., marked T. 27 S, R. 9 W, S 2, B.T.

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.70°30'W., 34 lks. dist. marked T. 27 S, R. 9 W, S 3, B.T.

A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.8°W., 31 lks. dist., marked T. 26 S, R. 9 W, S 34, B.T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, 2nd and 3rd rates.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, myrtle, maple, laurel and chinopin.

Undergrowth, rhododendron, laurel, salmon berry, and salal.

Mountainous or heavily timbered land, 80.00 chs.
