CHAINS	East, on true line bet. secs. 1 and 36.
	Var. 19°15'E.
	Over level bottom lands, heavily timbered, dense undergrowth.
10.00	Left bank of Coos River, thence over low gravel bar, bears NW & SE.
12.24	Coos River; at this season of the year, 60 lks. wide; runs N 65°W, bedrock bottom, in places covered with boulders and large gravel stones; water about 6 ins. deep except in holes; when swollen by rains, or melting snow would be a good stream in which to run sawlogs.
13.40	Top of right bank, 35 ft. high, bears N.65°W and S 65°E, ascend gradually.
17.90	Top of point; 75 ft. above Coos River, course S.
18.90	Spring branch in cut, 20 ft. deep, runs S, and ascend along the SW slope of mountain.
37.15	Top of spur, course S, 550 ft. above Coos River.
39.05	Ravine, course S, 480 ft. above Coos River.
40.00	Set dogwood post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor, marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N face, from which A fir, 20 ins, diam., bears N.11°E., 12 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S, B.T. A fir, 13 ins. diam., bears S.27°E., 31 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S, B.T. This cor. is about 500 ft. above Coos River.
45.90	Top of spur, course S, about 660 ft. above Coos River.
50.00	Spring branch 3 lks. wide, runs S 640 ft. above Coos River.
58.90	Top of spur, course S, about 900 Ft. above Coos River.
63.90	Ravine, course S, about 860 Ft. above Coos River.
80.00	The cor. of Tps. 26 and 27 S, R's. 8 and 9 W. This cor. is about 1325 ft. above Coos River. Land, W, 13.40 chs. level bottom; remainder mountainous and rugged. Soil on bottom, good 2nd rate; on upland 3rd and 4th rates. Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, myrtle, maple, laurel, and chincopin.
