

Subdivisions of T. 27 S., R. 1 W.

CHAINS

- 39.75 Set a basalt stone, 12x8x8 ins., 8 ins. in ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face, from which
 A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.68 $\frac{1}{2}$ *E. 46 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 11 B T.
 A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.17*W. 58 lks. dist. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 14 B T.
- 43.25 A spring branch, 3 lks. wide, course NE.
- 47.50 Maude E. Early's foundation of cabin bears N. about 50 lks. dist.
 M. Daley's cabin bears S. about 25 lks. dist.
- 50.75 A spring branch, 3 lks. wide, course S.
- 58.65 A trail, bears NE. and SW.
- 72.50 M. Early's cabin bears N. about 25 lks. dist.
- 79.50 The cor. of secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15.
 Land, mountainous.
 Soil, 4th rate.
 Timber, fir, hemlock and pine.
 Undergrowth, laurel, vine maple and huckleberry.
 Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth, 79.50 chs.
 July 17, 1902.

At the cor. of secs. 10, 11, 14 and 15.

Thence I run

N.0*2'W. bet. secs. 10 and 11.

Ascend through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

- 14.60 A spring branch, 2 lks. wide, course W.

Steeper ascent.

- 36.15 Impassable cliff, bears E. and W.

To get over the cliff I offset as follows:

East 50 lks.

N.0*2'W. 5.25 chs.

West 50 lks. to point on line bet. secs. 10 and 11.
