Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered
with dense undergrowth, 79.80 chs.

July 22, 1902.

At the cor. of secs. 32 and 33 on the 6th standard
parallel S. which I established June 19, 1902.

Thence I run

N.0°3'W. bet. secs. 32 and 33.

Descend through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

39.80 A spring branch, 4 lks. wide, course N.30°E. .

Thence along E. slope.

A hemlock, 12 ins. diam., bears S.30°W. 50 lks. dist.
