CHAINS

80.50 Intersect N. and S. line 21 lks. N. of the cor. of secs.
15, 16, 21 and 22.

Thence I run

N.89°39'W. on a true line bet. secs. 16 and 21.

Along side of mountain bears E. and W.

Through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

40.25 Set a basalt stone, 12x8x6 ins., 8 ins. in ground for
 $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on N. face, from which

A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears North, 12 lks. dist.
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 16 B T.

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.50°W. 47 lks. dist.
marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 21 B T.

45.40 A spring branch, 2 lks. wide, course NW.

49.45 Klamath Trail, bears N.20°E. and S.20°W.

52.00 Enter river bottom, bears N.60°W. and S.60°E.

61.60 A spring branch, 5 lks. wide, course SW.

66.00 Settler's cabin, bears S. 50 lks. dist.

67.50 Little River, 100 lks. wide, course N.60°W.

80.50 The cor. of secs. 16, 17, 20 and 21.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, 2nd rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, cedar, maple and pine.

Undergrowth, vine maple, laurel, willow and huckleberry.

Mountainous or heavily timbered land or land covered
with dense undergrowth, 80.50 chs.

N.0°3'W. bet. secs. 16 and 17.

Along hillside, bears N. and S.

Through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

3.50 A spring branch, 8 lks. wide, course E.

19.00 Little River, 60 lks. wide, course NW.

Thence over river bottom.

29.75 Klamath Trail, bears SE. and NW.
