A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.54*E. 49 lks. dist. marked T 27 S R 1 W S 20 B T. A hemlock, 14 ins. diam., bears S.41*W. 92 lks. dist. marked T 27 S R 1 W S 19 B T.
