- 11.50 Summit of ridge, E and W.
- 21.00 Spring branch 2 lks. wide, course SW.
- 25.50 Stream 4 lks. wide, course NW.
- 40.00 Set Cedar post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., firmly in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor. marked on E and W faces $\frac{1}{4}$ S from which
- A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.62°W., 13 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
- A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears N.40°E., 32 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
- 56.00 Spring branch 2 lks. wide, course NW.
- 80.00 Corner to Secs. 1, 6, 31 and 36 being corner also to T 27 S, Ranges 2 and 3 W.
- Land, 3rd rate and 4th rate.
- Ridges high, mountainous and rocky; densely covered with forests of Cedar, Fir, Hemlock and Laurel, with thick undergrowth of Huckleberry, Vinemaple and Hazel.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

The exterior lines of Township 27 S, R 3 W., pass over a very broken and rough section of country, particularly the first mile from SW corner running East, the line running North from SE corner to intersect the East fork of N. Umpqua River, also about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile of the NE boundary of Section 1.
