

Sixth Standard Parallel South, R. 2 W.

CHAINS

This mile is high, rocky and mountainous.

Soil, 4th rate.

Densely covered with Fir, Cedar, Hemlock and Laurel, and a thick undergrowth of Vinemaple, Huckleberry and Hazel.

East, on South Boundary of Sec. 32.

Va.19°45'E.

- 3.00 Summit of ridge, course SE and NW.
- 30.84 Stream 3 lks. wide, course SE.
- 40.00 Set Cedar post 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for standard $\frac{1}{2}$ Sec. cor. marked S C $\frac{1}{2}$ S on N face, from which
- A Cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears S.62°E., 8 lks. dist., marked S C $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.
 - A Hemlock, 8 ins. diam., bears N.12°W., 20 lks. dist., marked S C $\frac{1}{2}$ S B T.
- 80.00 Set Cedar post 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for standard cor. to Secs. 32 and 33 and marked S C T 27 S R 2 W on N, S 33 on E and S 32 on W faces, with 4 notches on E and 2 on W faces, from which
- A Fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N.45°E., 9 lks. dist. marked T 27 S R 2 W S 33 B T.
 - A Fir, 16 ins. diam., bears N.25°W., 5 lks. dist., marked T 27 S R 2 W S 32 B T.
 - A Fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S.30°W., 98 lks. dist., marked T 28 S R 2 W S 5 B T.

This mile is rough and mountainous, densely covered with forests of Fir, Cedar, Hemlock and Laurel. Thick undergrowth of Vinemaple, Hazel, Huckleberry and Balm.
