East, on South boundary of Sec. 33.

Va. 18° E.

- 16.25 Spring branch 2 lks. wide, course S.
- 29.50 Ascend steep butte.
- 37.50 Summit of mountain.
- 40.00 Set Fir post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for standard  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. cor. marked S C  $\frac{1}{4}$  S on N face, from which
- A Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N. 70° E., 58 lks. dist., marked S C  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.
- A Fir, 7 ins. diam., bears N. 30° E., 64 lks. dist., marked S C  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.
- 57.00 Enter burn at 40.00 chs. and leave at 57 chs.
- 60.00 Spring branch 2 lks. wide, course S.
- 61.00 Spring branch 2 lks. wide, course S.
- 80.00 Set Cedar post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for standard cor. to Secs. 33 and 34, marked S C T 27 S R 2 W on N, S 34 on E and S 33 on W with 3 notches on E and W edges, from which
- A Fir, 36 ins. diam., bears N. 65° E., 108 lks. dist., marked T 27 S R 2 W S 34 B T.
- A Cedar, 30 ins. diam., bears N. 85° W., 64 lks. dist., marked T 27 S R 2 W S 33 B T.
- A Fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S. 35° W., 65 lks. dist., marked T 28 S R 2 W S 4 B T.

This mile is mountainous and rough.

Soil, 3rd and 4th rate, densely covered with forests of Fir, Cedar, Hemlock and Pine.

Thick undergrowth of Huckleberry, Vinemaple and Hazel.

East, on South boundary of Sec. 34.

Va. 18° 45' E.

- 12.25 Spring branch 2 lks. wide, course South.
- 22.50 Stream 3 lks. wide, course SW.
