

Sixth Standard Parallel South, R. 2 W.

CHAINS

- 30.00 Enter swamp.
- 32.00 Leave swamp.
- 40.00 Set Yew post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for standard $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor. marked S C $\frac{1}{4}$ S on N face, from which
- A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears S.50*W., 13 lks. dist., marked S C $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
 - A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.10*E., 15 lks. dist., marked S C $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
- 57.00 Summit of ridge NW and SE (2500 ft. high).
- 80.00 Set Cedar post 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for standard cor. to Secs. 34 and 35, marked S C T 27 S R 2 W on N, S 35 on E and S 34 on W faces with 4 notches on W and 2 notches on E edges, from which
- A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.52*E., 30 lks. dist., marked T 27 S R 2 W S 35 B T.
 - A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears N.12*W., 13 lks. dist., marked T 27 S R 2 W S 34 B T.
 - A Hemlock, 20 ins. diam., bears S.25*E., 11 lks. dist., marked T 28 S R 2 W S 3 B T.

This mile is high and mountainous.

Land, 2nd rate, densely covered with forests of Fir, Cedar, Hemlock and Laurel; also thick undergrowth of Vinemaple, Hazel and Huckleberry.

East, on South boundary of Sec. 35.

Va. 18*30'E.

- 37.50 Summit of ridge, course N and S.
- 40.00 Set Yew post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for standard $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor. marked on N face S C $\frac{1}{4}$ S, from which
- A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.50*W., 19 lks. dist., marked S C $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
