80.80	Intersect the North boundary of township at 50 lks. West of cor. to secs. 5, 6, 31 & 32 which is a Cedar Post 4 ft. long 4 ins. sq. and firmly set in the ground and marked T 26 S R 2 W S 32 on NE, T 27 S R 2 W S 5 on SE T 27 S R 2 W S 6 on SW, T 26 S R 2 W S 31 on NW faces with 5 notches on the East and 1 on West edges from which <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A Cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears S.80*W., 18 lks. dist. Marked T 27 S R 2 W S 6 B T A Cedar, 16 ins. diam., bears N.45*W., 32 lks. dist. Marked T 26 S R 2 W S 31 B T A Cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears N.80*E., 36 lks. dist. Marked T 26 S R 2 W S 32 B T A Cedar, 20 ins. diam., bears S.55*E., 31 lks. dist. Marked T 27 S R 2 W S 5 B T
40.80	South, on true line bet. secs. 5 & 6 Set Laurel Post 3 ft. long 3 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on E & W faces from which <ul style="list-style-type: none"> A Fir, 32 ins. diam., bears S.60*E., 22 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S.80*W., 52 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T
80.80	The cor. to secs. 5, 6, 7 & 8 This mile is rough and mountainous densely covered with forests of Fir, Hemlock and Laurel Thick undergrowth of Fir, Vinemaple, Balm and Huckleberry September 7, 1882
