Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 16 B T A Madrone, 8 ins. diam., bears N.57*W., 32 lks. dist. Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 9 B T I destroy cor. and marks on bearing trees made August 5, 1905
65.00	Old Cabin bears S 40 lks.
66.00	Wolf Creek, 20 lks. wide course N.20*W.
69.00	Begin to ascend
80.00	The cor. of secs. 8, 9, 16 & 17. Set a basalt stone 15 x 7 x 6 ins. 11 ins. in the ground for cor. of secs. 8, 9, 16 and 17 marked with 4 notches on S. and 4 notches on E. edge; from which A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N.81°E. 69 lks. dist. mkd: T 27 S R 2 W S 9 B T. A madrone, 14 ins. diam., bears S.31°E. 47 lks. dist., mkd: T 27 S R 2 W S 16 B T. A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.56°W. 15 lks. dist., mkd: T 27 S R 2 W S 17 B T. A fir, 40 ins. diam., bears N.19°W. 69 lks. dist., mkd: T 27 S R 2 W S 8 B T. Land rolling and mountainous. Soil, rocky, 3rd and 4th rate. Timber, fir, pine and cedar, undergrowth, young fir and vine maple. Mountainous land or covered with dense undergrowth 80.00 chs. August 5: At this cor., I set off 17°1'N. on the dec. arc and 1905 at 12 h, 6 m P.M., l.m.t. observe the sun on the medidian, the resulting lat. is 43°14'.
