

Retracement of Subdivisions of T. 27 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

Over rolling land through scattering timber and dense undergrowth

39.10 Intersect $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. which is a post 3 ins. sq., 1 ft. high, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general

The course of the line from sec. cor. to $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. is N.89*51'W., 39.10 chs. distance

77.55 Intersect the W bdy. of the township, $\frac{1}{4}$ lks. N of cor. secs. 6, 7, 1 and 12 which is a post 4 ins. sq. 1 ft. above the ground firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general

The course of the line from $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. to sec. cor. is N.89*55'W., distance 38.45 chs.

Land rolling

Soil, rocky, 3rd. & 4th. rate

Timber, Fir and Pine; Undergrowth, young Fir, covered with dense undergrowth. 77.55 chs.

Retracement of the West Boundary of T. 27 South R 1 W.

Retracement of the East Boundary of T. 27 South, R 3 W.

Retracement of the 6th. Standard Parallel S., through R. 2 W.

Before commencing the subdivisions of remaining portion of T 27 S R 2 W; I retrace along the 6th. Standard Par., South, through R 2 W., along the S bdy. of this township and find the old work to be in very poor condition and out of limits for measurements and alinement therefore I continue my retracements along a portion of the West bdy. of T 27 S R 1 W the South boundaries of sec. 7, 8, 9, 10, 11 & 12 T.27 S., R 2 W and the East boundary of T 27 S R 3 W. These lines were also out of limits for measure-
