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Retracement of the West Boundary of T. 27 S., R. 1 W.

CHAINS

- 10.40 Top of rocky mountain, 500 ft. above cor., thence descend through heavy timber and undergrowth.
- 38.20 Canyon, course NE.
- 41.43 Fall 18 lks. W of the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. cor., which is a stone, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.

The true course of this line is N.0°15'E., and the length is 41.43 chs.

- 76.35 Creek, 8 lks. wide, course NW.

- 81.43 Fall 18 lks. W of the cor. of Secs. 25, 30, 31 and 36, which is a stone, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General, and which I now change to refer to Secs. 30 and 31, T 27 S., R 1 W only.

The true course of this line from the $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. corner is North and the length is 40.00 chs.

Timber, heavy Fir and Hemlock.

Dense undergrowth, little Fir and Hemlock.
