The true course of this line is North, and the length is 41.00 chs.</p> <p>78.50 Intersect the cor. of secs. 7 and 18 which is a stone, firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General; the true course of this line is North, and the length is 37.50 chs.</p> <p>The corner of secs. 12 and 13, T. 27 S., R 2 W., not having been found, I continue my retracement</p> <p>North, along W boundary of sec. 7</p> <p>88.48 Intersect the cor. of said secs. 12 and 13 which is a stone firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the surveyor general.
