N.0°21'E., retracing the E. bdy. of sec. 24

The $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. which is a post firmly set, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General, and which I now change to refer to sec. 24, T 27 S., R 3 W., only bears West, 50 lks. dist. The course of this line is N.0°21'W., and the length is 40.80 chs.

The cor. of secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24 which is a post firmly set marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General and which I now change to refer to secs. 13, and 24, T 27 S R 3 W only bears West 151 lks. dist. The course of this line from the $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. is N.1°01'W. and the length is 42.60 chs.
