CHAINS

N.55°E., 4.40 chs. dist.

Land Mountainous

Soil, 2nd. & 3rd. rate

Timber heavy Fir, Hemlock, Cedar and Madrone

Dense underbrush, little Fir, Hemlock and Vinemaple

Mountainous land, covered with heavy timber and dense
undergrowth and exceptionally difficult to survey.

September 29, 1911

At the cor. of secs. 25, 26, 35 & 36

Thence I run

East bet. secs. 25 & 36

Descend steep slope through dense timber and underbrush
exceptionally difficult to survey

14.80 Branch of Fish Creek, 5 lks. wide, course North

Ascend

26.00 Top of rocky ridge bears N & S

Descend

37.50 Dry Wash, course North

Ascend

40.00 Set a Yew Post 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground
for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 25 on N and 36 on S face from
whichA Hemlock, 10 ins. diam., bears S.62°30'W., 13 lks.
dist., Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 36 B TA Fir, 48 ins. diam., bears N.21°W., 55 lks. dist.,
Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 25 B TAt this cor. I set off 2°35'S., on the decl. arc., and
observe the sun on the meridian at noon; the resulting
lat. is 43°11'N.43.00 Derricks $\frac{1}{4}$ cor. which I now destroy bears N. 300 lks. dist.

53.00 Top of ridge bears N and S

81.00 Rangers Trail, bears N & S

82.10 Creek, 15 lks. wide course North
