CHAINS

43.50 Creek, 10 lks. wide, course NW.
Ascend.

46.00 Top of ridge, bears NW and SE.
Descend.

56.00 Creek 6 lks. wide, course NW.
Ascend.

69.50 Rugged rocky point, 100 ft. high.
Descend.

80.00 Set a Hemlock post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. of Secs. 23, 24, 25 and 26, marked T 27 S S 24 on NE, R 2 W S 25 on SE, S 26 on SW and S 23 on NW face, with 2 notches on S and 1 notch on E edge, from which

A Fir, 48 ins. diam., bears N.70°15'E., 27 lks. dist., marked T 27 S R 2 W S 24 B T.

A Hemlock, 20 ins. diam., bears S.27°E., 35 lks. dist., marked T 27 S R 2 W S 25 B T.

A Hemlock, 24 ins. diam., bears S.12°10'W., 65 lks. dist., marked T 27 S R 2 W S 26 B T.

A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.11°45'W., 24 lks. dist., marked T 27 S R 2 W S 23 B T.

Derricks cor. of Secs. 23, 24, 25 and 26, which I now destroy, bears N.45°30'E., 570 lks. dist.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, 1st and 2nd rate.

Timber, heavy Fir, Hemlock, Cedar and Pine.

Mountainous land covered with heavy timber and dense undergrowth and exceptionally difficult to survey.
