

Extension Survey of Subdivision of T. 27 S., R. 2 W., W.M.

CHAINS

Descend

69.00 Draw, course North

Ascend

77.15 Top of ridge

Rangers trail along ridge, course NE and SW

83.00 Intersect West boundary of T 27 S., R 1 W., 140 lks.

S.0°4'E., of cor. of secs. 18 & 19

At point of intersection I set a Cedar Post 3 ft. long

4 ins. sq. 24 ins. in the ground for closing cor. of secs.

13 & 24 marked C C T 27 S R 2 W on W., S 13 on N and S

24 on S face with 3 grooves on N and S faces, from which

A Cedar, 24 ins. diam., bears N.67°45'W., 38 lks. dist.

Marked T 27 S R 2 W S 13 B T

A Chinquapin, 8 ins. diam., bears S.35°30'W., 38 lks.

dist., Marked T 27 S R 2 W S 24 B T

Land Mountainous

Soil, 1st. and 2nd. rate

Timber, heavy Fir, Hemlock, Cedar and Pine

Dense undergrowth of little Fir, Hemlock and Vinemaple

Mountainous land, covered with heavy timber and dense

undergrowth, and exceptionally difficult to survey, 83.00

chs.

Sky overcast at noon; observation for flat. impossible

October 4, 1911

At the cor. of secs. 13, 14, 23 and 24

Thence I run

N.0°01'W, bet. secs. 13 & 14

Ascend steep slope through dense timber and undergrowth

exceptionally difficult to survey

8.00 Top of ridge bears NE & SW

Descend

9.20 Creek, 15 lks. wide course NE; Ascend

10.25 Top of ridge bears NE & SW; descend

12.70 Creek, 15 lks. wide, course NE

25.90 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course NE
