the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 23 on N. and 26 on South face from which

A Hemlock, 36 ins. diam., bears S.88°0'E., 25 lks. dist., Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 28 B T

A Hemlock, 20 ins. diam., bears N.61°W., 22 lks. dist., Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 23 B T

40.30 "Cut Off" trail, bears North and South

42.60 Creek, 3 lks. wide, course NE., Ascend

44.85 Ridge, course NE and SW., Descend

47.80 Creek, 1 lk. wide, course NE

51.40 Ranger trail to Peel and Red Butte, course North and South

65.85 Cabin bears South 4.00 chs. dist.

79.85 Cor. of secs. 22, 23, 26 & 27

Land Mountainous

Soil, 1st. and 2nd. rate

Timber, heavy Fir, Hemlock and Cedar

Dense undergrowth, little Fir, Hemlock and Cedar

At this cor. I set off 7°34'S., on the decl. arc., and observe the sun on the meridian, at noon; the resulting lat. is 43°12' North

N.0°02'W., bet. secs. 22 & 23

Over plateau, through dense undergrowth and heavy timber exceptionally difficult to survey

40.00 Set a Cedar Post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 22 on W., and 23 on E. face from which

A Cedar, 16 ins. diam., bears S.58°15'E., 38 lks. dist., Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 23 B T

A Cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears S.24°15'W., 35 lks. dist., Marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 22 B T

Derricks $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., which I now destroy bears North 25°E.,
