

Extension Survey of Subdivision of T. 27 S., R. 2 W. W.M.

CHAINS

A Madrone, 18 ins. diam., bears S.25*10'W., 30 lks. dist., marked T 27 S R 2 W S 17 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky, 3rd rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Cedar and Sugar Pine.

Dense undergrowth of little Fir, Hemlock and Rhododendron.

Mountainous land, covered with heavy timber and dense undergrowth, exceptionally difficult to survey.

89.20 chains.

October 23, 1911.

At the cor. of Secs. 29, 30, 31 and 32.

Thence I run

S.0*04'E., bet. Secs. 31 and 32.

Ascend steep slope, through dense timber and underbrush, exceptionally difficult to survey.

9.70 Top of ridge, bears E and W. Old trail, along ridge; descend.

16.00 Dry canyon, course W; ascend.

40.00 Set a Fir post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for 1/2 Sec. cor., marked 1/2 S 31 on W and 32 on E face, from which

A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S.44*10'E., 16 lks. dist., marked 1/2 S 32 B T.

A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.3*30'W., 19 lks. dist., marked 1/2 S 31 B T.

Derricks 1/2 Sec. cor., which I now destroy, bears W 400 lks. dist.

47.00 Top of rocky ridge, bears E and W; descend.

66.55 Dry canyon, course E.

79.15 Intersect S boundary of Tp. 350 lks. N.88*57'E of the old cor. of Secs. 31 and 32, which I previous^{ly} changed to an angle point (See book of retracements).

At point of intersection, I set a Laurel post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for closing cor.
