

## Extension Survey of Subdivision of T. 27 S., R. 2 W., W.M.

CHAINS

- A Hemlock, 24 ins. diam., bears S.33\*30'W., 16 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 29 B T.
- A Cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears N.21\*E., 39 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 20 B T.
- 41.90 Derricks  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. cor., which I now destroy, bears N 500 lks. dist.
- 46.40 Creek, 4 lks. wide, course NE.
- 80.24 The corner of Secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30.  
Land, mountainous.  
Soil, 1st and 2nd rate.  
Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Cedar and Pine.  
Dense undergrowth of little Fir, Hemlock, Cedar & Vinemaple.  
Mountainous land, covered with heavy timber and dense undergrowth & exceptionally difficult to survey. 80.24 chs.  
October 26, 1911.
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- At the cor. of Secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30.  
Thence I run  
West, bet. Secs. 19 and 30.  
Descend through dense timber and undergrowth, exceptionally difficult to survey.
- 8.55 Across burn; leave timber and brush, bears N and S. Creek, 2 lks. wide, course N.
- 33.55 Top of ridge, bears N and S. Leave burn, bears N and S. Descend ridge, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
- 40.00 Set a Cedar post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. cor. marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 19 on N and 30 on S face, from which  
A Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.0\*30'E., 31 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 30 B T.  
A Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.31\*W., 22 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S 19 B T.
- 42.00 Derricks  $\frac{1}{4}$  Sec. cor., which I now destroy, bears N 300 lks. dist.
- 61.25 Leave green timber, across burn, bears N and S.
