

Extension Survey of Subdivision of T. 27 S., R. 2 W., W.M.

CHAINS

At point of intersection, I set a Cedar post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for closing cor. of Secs. 17 and 18, marked C C T 27 S R 2 W on S, S 17 on E and S 18 on W face, with 1 groove on W and 5 grooves on E face, from which

A Fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.19°30'E., 42 lks. dist., marked T 27 S R 2 W S 17 B T.

A Fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.61°50'W., 12 lks. dist., marked T 27 S R 2 W S 18 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky and 3rd rate.

Timber, Fir, Hemlock, Cedar and Sugar Pine.

Dense undergrowth of little Fir, Hemlock & Rhododendron.

Mountainous land, covered with heavy timber and dense undergrowth & exceptionally difficult to survey. 87.80 chs.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This township is rough and mountainous, some of the higher peaks are as much as 4000 ft. above sea level.

The soil, wherever it is level on the Eastern part, is very good; in the West, along Wolf Creek, it is rocky and badly burned out by severe forest fires. Along

Wolf Creek ledges of rock crop out in places and all of

the higher summits are ledges of Basalt. There is no mineral of any value. This township is covered by one of the finest bodies of timber in the Cascades; some 160 acres will cruise 15 million feet, board measure. It is well watered. Creeks and Springs abound. At some previous time there must have been many settlers in this township, as shown by the numerous cabins and clearings. Many of the cabins are of unusual size and finish. There are but two settlers at present in this township as hereinafter noted. I. L. Bourgeois, is in the SE $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 24., T 27 S., R. 2 W., has been on his place more than nine years. He has a good log cabin, barn 24x33 ft., made of split boards and good out buildings. He has a clearing of nearly 12 acres fenced in by rail fence and seeded to Timothy Hay for several years. He has a good garden and raises potatoes, cabbage, etc., and also some small fruits, strawberries, raspberries and blackberries. Joseph Nebat, is in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ Sec. 25, T. 27 S., R 2 W., has been on his place
