80.80 Cor. to sec. 3, 4, 9 and 10.

This mile is rough and mountainous.

Land, 2nd rate.

Densely covered with forests of Fir, Cedar, Laurel, and Hemlock, with thick undergrowth of Vine maple and Huckleberry.

Va.19*E.

North, on random bet. secs. 3 and 4.

22.00 Blazed trail, E. and W.

40.00 Set tem. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.

47.50 Fir tree, 24 ins. dia.

81.15 Intersect line, 75 lks. west from cor. to secs. 3, 4, 33 and 34, which is a post, 4 ins. sq., mkd. T 26 S R 3 W S 34 on NE., R 3 W S 33 on NW., T 27 S R 3 W S 4 on SW., and S 3 on SE., faces, with 3 notches on E. and W. edges.

Thence I run.

S.0*32*W., on true line bet. secs. 3 and 4, with same Va.

41.15 Set Laurel post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., firmly in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor, from whichA Pine, 7 ins. dia., bears S.10*W., 11 lks. dis. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.A Fir, 16 ins. dia., bears S.25*E., 7 lks. dis. mkd. $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
