

## Meanders of South Fork of Umpqua River.

thence on Left Bank up stream.

GENERAL DESCRIPTION

This Township, like most of the others, in the Umpqua River, is composed of small valleys and high rolling hills, principally openings, sometimes brushy. The Ravines and on North slopes, timber is frequently composed of Fir, Maple, Pine, etc. The soil on the hills is generally 2nd rate though sometime 3rd rate and often 1st rate, and it is said will produce better wheat than the valleys.

The valleys are small - soil is black mould mixed with small broken stone or gravel - it cracks very badly but seems to produce well and is gravelly 1st rate. Deer Creek, a fine mountain stream from 25 to 50 lks. wide, runs through the whole township and on it is the principal settlement.
