	North, on true line, between Secs. 30 and 25, Va. $19\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E.	
5.00	Offset East, 5 chs., to avoid rocky precipice, and North 12.40 chs.; thence West to line.	+100 × +400
31.00	Offset East and North	+100
39.00	Offset back to line.	+200
40.00	Set $\frac{1}{2}$ Sec. post, from which A Cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears S. $13\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 188 lks. dist. A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 35° W., 192 lks.	-10
40.00	Summit of mountain, bears S. about 9 chs.	
80.00	Set post, cor. Secs. 19, 30, 24 and 25, from which A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N. 31° W., 34 lks. dist. A Fir, 5 ins. diam., bears N. 9° E., 22 lks. dist. A Fir, 40 ins. diam., bears S. 71° E., 30 lks. dist. A Fir, 12 ins. diam., bears S. 69° E., 25 lks. dist. On this mile enter mountains, climbing a bluff of almost perpendicular rocks, after which the surface is rolling. Timber, principally Fir, with scattering Cedar, Hemlock, Laurel and Chinquapin.	-50
