45.75 Summit of ridge, East and West.

78.50 Cor. to Tps. 26 and 27 S., Rs. 7 and 8 W.

July 7, 1881.

Subdivisions of T. 27 S., R. 7 W.
same Deputies and Contract.

Commenced at the cor. of Secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30, post gone - made a new post 4 ins. diam., 3½ ft. long, and set firmly in the ground, from which,

An Ash, 24 ins. diam., bears N.77°E., 197 lks. dist.

An Ash, 20 ins. diam., bears S.59°E., 40 lks. dist.

An Ash, 24 ins. diam., bears S.15°W., 12 lks. dist.

An Ash, 20 ins. diam., bears S.45°W., 100 lks. dist.

Thence West, on random, between Secs. 19 and 30.

Va.19°30'E.

4.00 Trail, North and South- Also J. Purdie's house, about 8 chs. South.

15.00 Began to ascend Coast Range mountain and enter Fir timber.

36.00 Cliff of rocks.

40.00 Set temporary ¼ Sec. cor.

46.50 Impassible cliff of rocks, at which I ran N.45°W., 2.00 chs., thence S.45°W., 2 chs. which makes the distance

49.32 Line by calculation, 2.82 chs.

54.50 Summit of Coast Range Mountains.

80.41 Intersect line, 61 lks. South from cor. to Secs. 19, 30, 24 and 25.

July 12, 1881.

Thence, I run S.89°34'E., on true line, between Secs. 19 and 30, with same Var.

40.41 Set Cedar ¼ post, 4 ins. diam., 3 ft. long, firmly in the ground, from which
