20.00 Top of ridge, 200 ft. above cor. bears NE.

31.00 Descend from summit of ridge to

31.50 Stream, 3 lks wide, flows E.

40.00 Set yew post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on W. face; from which

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.38°E., 3 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.26°W., 75 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

51.00 Creek, 10 lks. wide, flows E. 200 ft. below ridge.

61.00 Top of ridge, 350 ft. above creek, bears NE. and SW.

Descend

80.00 Set a yew post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35, 100 ft. below ridge, marked T 27 $\frac{1}{4}$ S 26 on NE., R 8 W S 35 on SE., S 34 on SW., and S 27 on NW. faces; with 1 notch on S. and 2 notches on E. edges; from which
