

## Subdivisions of T. 27 S., R. 8 W.

## CHAINS

- 44.00 Top of ridge, 500 ft. above sec. cor. and descend over uneven ground: ridge bears NW. and SE.
- 80.05 The cor. to secs. 27, 28, 33 and 34.  
Land, mountainous.  
Soil, 3rd rate.  
Timber, fir; hemlock and cedar. East 40. chs. live timber, West 40.05 chs. dead and partly fallen.  
Undergrowth; fir and hemlock.  
Mountainous land, or land covered with dense undergrowth, 80.05 chs.

- N.0\*2'W. bet. secs. 27 and 28.  
Descend from cor.
- 33.00 Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, flows NE.  
(Some indication of stone coal at the crossing, which is 150 ft. below cor.) Ascend 100 ft. to
- 36.50 Summit of spur, bears N. and descend.
- 40.00 Set cedar post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for  $\frac{1}{2}$  sec. cor. marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S. on W. face; from which  
A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.52 $\frac{1}{2}$ \*E., 75 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S B T.  
A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N.62\*W., 42 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{2}$  S B T.
- 53.50 Branch, 2 lks. wide, course E.
- 80.00 Set a yew post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 21, 22, 27 and 28, marked T 27 S S 22 on NE., R 8 W S 27 on SE., S 28 on SW., and S 21 on NW. faces, marked with 2 notches on S. and 3 notches on E. edges; from which  
A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.58\*E., 21 lks. dist., marked T 27 S R 8 W S 22 B T.
