

Subdivisions of T. 27 S., R. 8 W.

CHAINS

2.00 Stream, 5 lks. wide, course NW. and ascend.

35.00 Summit of ridge, 300 ft. above stream, bears NW.

37.00 Fir, 48 ins. diam. on line. I mark with 2 notches on N. and S. sides.

39.94 Set yew post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S on W. face; from which

A cedar, 50 ins. diam., bears S.55*W., 228 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A fir, 74 ins. diam., bears S.9*E., 294 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

45.00 A fir, 84 ins. diam. on line. I mark with 2 notches on N. and S. sides.

54.00 Branch, 4 lks. wide, course NW.

79.94 The cor. to secs. 3, 4, 9 and 10. 500 ft. above stream at 2.00 chs.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, 1st rate.

Very little live timber, of fir, hemlock and cedar.

Undergrowth, mountain balm, laurel, maple, willow and briars.

Mountainous land, or land covered with dense undergrowth, 79.94 chs.

Note: Dense smoke prevented taking lat. today.

From the cor. of secs. 32 and 33 on the South bdy. of the Tp. which is a yew post set by me in the survey of the S. bdy. of this Tp. thence I run

N.0*3'W. bet. secs. 32 and 33.
