CHAINS

31.00 Wilson Creek, 20 lks. wide, course NW. at the junction of small creek, thence over nearly level ground.

37.00 Branch, 1 lk. wide, course SW.

40.00 Set fir post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on W. face; from which

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears N.50*E., 37 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.30*W., 10 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.

74.00 Creek, 10 lks. wide, course W.; ascend.

80.00 Set yew post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32 and 33, marked T 27 S S 28 on NE., R 8 W S 33 on SE., S 32 on SW., and S 29 on NW. faces, with 1 notch on S. and 4 notches on E. edges; from which

A hemlock, 30 ins. diam., bears N.30*E., 5 lks. dist., marked T 27 S R 8 W S 28 B T.

A fir, 36 ins. diam., bears S.46*E., 13 lks. dist., marked T 27 S R 8 W S 33 B T.

A hemlock, 36 ins. diam., bears S.62*W., 45 lks. dist., marked T 27 S R 8 W S 32 B T.

A hemlock, 12 ins. diam., bears N.65*W., 47 lks. dist., marked T 27 S R 8 W S 29 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, 2nd rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock and cedar.

Undergrowth, laurel, vinemaple, salal and fern.

Mountainous land, or land covered with dense underbrush, 80.00 chs.
