CHAINS	
40.00	Set temp. $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
80.16	Intersect N. and S. line, 27 lks. S. of cor. to secs. 27, 28, 33 and 34. thence I run S.89*48'W. on a true line bet. secs. 28 and 33. Descend from cor. through dead timber.
10.00	Ravine, 50 ft. below cor. course S.25*W. thence ascend
20.00	Enter live timber, bears nearly N. and S.
40.08	Set cedar post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S. on N. face; from which A cedar, 12 ins. diam., bears N.59*W., 49 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T. ( 100 ft. above ravine) A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears S. 67*W., 100 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S B T.
	Descend from $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
60.00	Branch, 3 lks. wide, course SW.
67.50	Branch, 2 lks. wide, course S. 400 ft. below $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor.
80.16	The cor. of secs. 28, 29, 32 and 33, 100 ft. above stream. Land, mountainous. Soil 2nd rate. Timber, fir, hemlock and cedar, on 1st 20.00 chs. dead and fallen, on the last 60.16 chs. good green timber. Undergrowth, arrow-wood, willow, hemlock and briars. Mountainous land, or land covered with dense undergrowth, 80.16 chs.
