70.00 Begin gradual ascent, bears S.75*E. and N.75*W.

80.00 The cor. of secs. 4, 5, 8, and 9.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, 2nd, and 3rd. rates.

Timber, fir, pine, hemlock, laurel, and maple.

Undergrowth, laurel, willow and huckleberry.

Mountainous, or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth. 80.00 chs.

August 23, 1902

N.0*3'W., bet. secs. 4 and 5.

Ascend through heavy timber and dense undergrowth, bears E. and W.

28.90 Intersect the 6th. standard parallel South, 20 lks. E. of the cor. of secs. 32 and 33.

Set a basalt stone, 12x8x8 ins., 8 ins. in the ground for closing cor. of secs. 4 and 5, marked with C C. on S. and 4 notches on E. and 2 notches on W. edges; from which,

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S.15*E., 39 lks. dist., marked T 28 S R 1 W S 4 B T.

A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears SW. 68 lks. dist., marked T. 28 S R 1 W S 5 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, stony and 4th. rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock, laurel and pine.

Undergrowth, laurel.

Mountainous, or heavily timbered land or land covered with dense undergrowth. 28.90 chs.

At the cor. of secs. 31 and 32 on the S. bdy. which

I established, August 6, 1902.

Thence I run.

Ascend through scattering timber and dense undergrowth.
