General Description

This township is mountainous through out its whole extent.

The soil is of a poor quality and can nearly all be
classed as 3rd and 4th rates. In a few places only is
there to be found grasses suitable for grazingFir, pine, hemlock, cedar and laurel and other kinds
of timber are found over the entire township.The township is well watered by many small streams
which have a general southerly course.There are four settlers each in secs. 16 and 36 and two
each in secs. 4 and 9.
