A fir, 30 ins. diam., bears N.5*W., 58 lks. dist.

This mile is very rough, rocky and mountainous.

Land, 3d and 4th rate.

Densely covered with forests of fir, cedar, hemlock
and laurel.

Thick undergrowth of vine maple, hazel, huckleberry

and S 12 on NW faces, with 2 notches on N and 4 on S edges,
