10.00 Enter heavy timber.

40.00 Set granite stone, 8x10x15 ins., 10 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W face, from which

A fir, 10 ins. diam., bears S.79*E., 27 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 31 B T.

A fir, 7 ins. diam., bears S.66*W., 6 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 36 B T.

65.00 Top of Castle Rock ridge, bears E and W.; descend NE slope.

80.00 Set fir post, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. secs. 30, 31, 25 and 36, marked T 28 S S 30 on NE., R 2 W S 31 on SE., R 3 W S 36 on SW., and S 25 on NW face, with 5 notches on N and 1 notch on S edge, from which

A fir, 5 ins. diam., bears N.13*30'E., 31 lks. dist., marked T 28 S R 2 W S 30 B T.

A chinquapin, 5 ins. diam., bears S.43*15'E., 31 lks. dist., marked T 28 S R 2 W S 31 B T.

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S.15*W., 53 lks. dist., marked T 28 S R 3 W S 36 B T.

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.60*W., 42 lks. dist., marked T 28 S R 3 W S 25 B T.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky; 4th rate.

Timber, fir, hemlock and cedar.

Underbrush, rhododendrons, young firs, poison oak and vine maple.

Land mountainous, covered with dense underbrush or heavily timbered and exceptionally difficult to survey, 80.00 chs.
