Thence I run

N on true line, bet. secs. 19 and 24, through dense underbrush and heavy timber; descend N slope.

5.00 Ascend S slope.

35.00 Top of ridge, bears E and W.; descend.

40.00 Set lava stone, 7x10x14 ins., 10 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ on W face, from which

A yew, 7 ins. diam., bears S.13*E., 23 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 19 B T.

A hemlock, 16 ins. diam., bears S.58*W., 37 lks. dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 24 B T.

55.80 Cliff of rock, 50 ft. high.

72.55 Boulder Creek, 4 lks. wide, flows NE.

75.16 Cor. secs. 13, 18, 19 and 24.

Land, mountainous.

Soil, rocky; 4th rate.

Timber, fir, cedar and hemlock.

Underbrush, young firs, greasewood, rhododendrons.

E on S bdy. sec. 31, through dense underbrush and scattering timber; ascend SW slope of mountain.

3.00 Top of ridge, bears N and S.; descend E slope.

12.40 South Myrtle Creek, 6 lks. wide, flows SW.; ascend NW slope.

19.07 Top of ridge, bears SE and NW.; descend NE slope.

25.45 Creek, 2 lks. wide, flows NW.

26.30 Same creek, flows SW.; ascend NW slope.

40.00 Set cedar stake, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor. marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 31 on N face,
