

## Subdivision of T. 28 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

80.00 Set fir stake, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. secs. 22, 23, 26 and 27, marked T 28 S S 23 on NE., R 2 W S 26 on SE., S 27 on SW., and S 22 on NW. face, with two notches on S and E edges, and dig pits, 18x18x12 ins., in each sec. 5½ ft. dist., and raise mound of earth, 3½ ft. base, 1½ ft. high, W of cor., from which

A cedar, 18 ins. diam., bears S.71\*W., 24 lks. dist., marked T 28 S R 2 W S 27 B T.

A cedar, 10 ins. diam., bears N.58\*W., 11 lks. dist. marked T 28 S R 2 W S 22 B T.

No other tree fit to mark.

Land, rough and mountainous.

Soil, rocky; 4th rate.

Timber, fir, cedar and hemlock.

Underbrush, rhododendrons, young firs, vine maple and greasewood.

Land mountainous, covered with dense underbrush and exceptionally difficult to survey, 80.00 chs.

N.3'E., on true line, bet. secs. 22 and 23.

Through dense underbrush and heavy timber; ascend SE. slope.

8.00 Ridge, bears NE and SW., descend W slope.

16.00 Ascend W slope

35.45 Top of ridge, bears E and W., descend N slope.

40.00 Set fir stake, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for ¼ sec. cor., marked ¼ S 22 on W and 23 on E face, from which

A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.35\*W., 11 lks. dist., marked ¼ S 22 B T.
