CHAINS

- 77.25 Intersect N and S line, 30 lks. S of the cor. of secs. 26, 27, 34 and 35.
- Thence, S.89°47'E., on a true line, bet. secs. 26 and 35. Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
- Descend 350 feet over NE slope to
- 7.83 Brook, 4 lks. wide, course SE.; ascend 250 feet over SW slope to
- 18.00 Spur, slopes SE.; ascend 230 feet, over SW slope to
- 36.50 Spur, slopes SE.; descend gradually to
- 37.25 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in.diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked

- Land, mountainous.
- Soil, clay loam and rocky; 2d, 3d and 4th rate.
- Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock and pine.
- Undergrowth, rhododendron, chinquapin, vine maple and hemlock.
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- North on a Sectional Guide Meridian bet. secs. 25 and 26.
- Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.
- Descend 175 feet, over NE slope to
- 15.83 South Fork of Dumore Creek, 12 lks. wide, course SE.;
