

County Surveyor's Record, Douglas County, Oregon

Subdivision of T. 28 S., R. 2 W.

CHAINS

Over mountainous land, through heavy timber and dense undergrowth.

Ascend gradually.

- 7.57 Creek, 4 lks. wide, course NW.
 9.00 Enter old burn, bears E and W.
 12.80 Foot of steep slope, bears NW and SE.; ascend 275 feet.
 20.90 Spur, slopes SW.
 25.50 Draw, opens NW.; ascend 200 feet to
 31.67 Top of small butte; descend 160 feet to
 40.00 Set an iron post, 3 ft. long, 1 in. diam., 27 ins. in the ground, for $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. cor., with brass cap marked

from which

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears S. $16\frac{1}{2}^{\circ}$ E., 176 lks.

dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 1 B T.

A fir, 6 ins. diam., bears N. 82° W., 43 lks.

dist., marked $\frac{1}{4}$ S 2 B T.

Descend 105 feet to

- 46.18 Brook, 2 lks. wide, course NW.; ascend 275 feet, over SW slope to spur.
 49.23 Brook, 3 lks. wide, course W.
 56.82 Trail, from Peel to Red Butte, bears NW and SE.
 65.00 Spur, slopes SW.; descend gradually.
 72.37 Intersect Sixth Standard Parallel South, and set closing corner of sections 1 and 2, 5.13 chs. N. $88^{\circ} 5'$ W., of the standard corner of sections 35 and 36 of T. 27 S., R. 2 W., as hereinbefore described.
- Land, mountainous.
 Soil, clay loam; 2nd and 3rd rate.
 Timber, fir, cedar, hemlock and pine.
 Undergrowth, rhododendron, chinquapin, vine maple and hemlock.
