CHAINS

- 80.00 Set Laurel post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. square, 24 ins. in the ground for cor. to secs. 15, 16, 21 and 22, marked T 28 S S 15 on NE, R 3 W S 22 on SE, S 21 on SW, and S 16 on NW faces, with 3 notches on E and S edges, from which
  - A Laurel, 10 ins. diam., bears N.55\*E., 56 lks. dist., marked T 28 S R 3 W S 15 B T.
  - A Fir, 24 ins. diam., bears S.45\*E., 105 lks. dist., marked T 28 S R 3 W S 22 B T.
  - A Laurel, 8 ins. diam., bears S.60\*W., 70 lks. dist., marked T 28 S R 3 W S 21 B T.
  - A Fir, 15 ins. diam., bears N.20\*W., 70 lks. dist., marked T 28 S R 3 W S 16 B T.

This mile is rough and steep.  
Soil, 4th grade.  
Densely covered with forests of Fir, Cedar and Hemlock.  
Undergrowth of Vine maple, Huckleberry and Balm.

- 23.00 Commenced to descend.
- 27.09 Bottom of dry ravine, course N.
- 40.00 Set Fir post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for  $\frac{1}{4}$  sec. cor., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S on N and S faces, from which
  - A Hemlock 6 ins. diam., bears N.20\*W., 6 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.
  - A Hemlock, 8 ins. diam., bears S.40\*W., 5 lks. dist., marked  $\frac{1}{4}$  S B T.
- 50.00 Spring branch, 2 lks. wide, course N.
- 60.00 Summit of Mountain, course N.
- 80.00 Set Cedar post, 4 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. to secs. 14, 15, 22 and 23, marked T 28 S S 14 on NE, R 3 W S 23 on SE, S 22 on SW, and S 15 on NW, faces with 2 notches on E and 3 on
