ground for cor to secs., 2, 3, 10 and 11, marked T 28 S S 2 on N. E., R 3 W S 11 on S.E., S 10 on S.W. and S. 3 on N. W. faces with 2 notches on E. and 5 on S. edges, from which:

A Fir, 16 ins. diam., bears, N. 22* E., 22 lks dist. marked T 28 S R 3 W S 2 B. T.

A Fir, 16 ins. diam., bears S.80*E., 26 lks dist. marked T 28 S R 3 W S 11 B. T.

A fir, 14 ins. diam., bears S. 25*W., 50 lks dist. marked T 28 S R 3 W S 10 B. T.

A Fir, 14 ins. diam., bears N.65*W., 45 lks dist. marked T 28 S R 3 W S 3 B. T.

This mile is rough and broken land, 3rd. rate.

Densely covered with forests of fir, hemlock, Cedar and Laurel.

Thick undergrowth of Vine, Maple, huckleberry and Balm.

80.45 intersect N. and S. line 23 lks S. of cor. to secs. 1, 2, 11 and 12.

S.89* 50' W. on true line bet. secs. 2 and 11 with same va.

40.22 Set yew post, 3 ft. long, 3 ins sq., 24 ins. in the ground for 1/4 sec. cor., marked on N. and S. faces 1/4 S., from which:

A Fir, 30 ins. diam., bears, N.27*E. 17 lks dist. marked 1/4 S.B.T.
