CHAINS	
	Top of ridge, bears E. and W., descend SW. slope.
51.60	Ravine, bears W., ascend NW slope.
56.20	Top of ridge, bears E. and W., descend W. slope.
65.00	Ascend W. slope.
72.37	Top of ridge, bears NW. and SE., descend SE. slope.
78.99	Intersect S. bdy. of T., 4 47 lks. W. of N. 1/4 cor., sec. 3.
	Set granite stone 6 x 10 x 14 ins., 10 ins. in the ground for closing cor. secs. 33 and 34, marked C C on N. face, with 3 grooves on E. and W. faces, from which:
	A laurel, 7 ins. diam., bears N.21°E.52 lks dist. marked T 28 S R 3 W S 34 B T.
	A laurel, 7 ins. diam., bears N.36°W., 26 lks dist. marked T 28 S R 3 W S 33 B T.
	Land, mountainous.
	Soil, rocky- 4th rate.
	Timber, cedar, fir, laurel and hemlock.
	Underbrush, rhododendrons and young firs.
	Land mountainous, covered with dense underbrush and heavily timbered and exceptionally difficult to survey.
	June 1, 1910.
	At cor. secs. 27, 28, 33 and 34.
	Thence I run
	North 2°W. on true line bet. secs. 27 and 28, through dense underbrush and heavy timber, descend N. slope.
3.10	Creek, 6 lks. wide, flows W., ascend SW. slope.
7.90	Top of ridge, bears E. and W., descend NW. slope.
16.30	Creek, 8 lks. wide, flows SW., ascend S. slope.
40.00	Set granite stone, 10 x 12 x 16 ins., 11 ins. in the ground for 1/4 sec. cor., marked 1/4 on W. face, from which:
	A fir, 24 ins. diam., bears E., 10 lks dist.
