52.50	<p>▲ cedar, 5 ins. diam., bears N.4*W., 12 lks.dist. marked 1/4 S 21 B. T.</p> <p>Top of ridge, bears SW. and NE., descend W. slope.</p>
79.52	<p>Cor. secs. 20,21,28 and 29.</p> <p>Land, mountainous</p> <p>Soil, rocky- 4th rate.</p> <p>Timber, cedar, fir, hemlock and matherone.</p> <p>Underbrush, rhododendrons, vinemaple, young firs, grease-wood and willows.</p> <p>Land mountainous, covered with dense underbrush and heavily timbered and exceptionally difficult to survey.</p> <p style="text-align: right;">June 7, 1910.</p>
40.00 75.68	<p>At cor. secs. 20,21, 28 and 29.</p> <p>Thence I run</p> <p>North, 3'W. on random line bet. secs. 20 and 21.</p> <p>Set temp. <math>\frac{1}{4}</math> sec. cor.</p> <p>Intersect E. and W. line, 148 lks. N.89*41'E. of cor. secs. 16, 17, 20 and 21, which is a stake greatly decayed, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.</p> <p>Set dogwood stake, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. secs. 16 and 17, marked T 28 S S 16 on NE., and R 3 W S 17 on NW. face, with 4 notches on E. and 2 notches on W. edge.</p> <p>Bearing trees in secs. 16 and 17, as described.</p> <p>I destroy markings on bearing trees referring to secs. 20 and 21.</p> <p>At point of intersection set dogwood stake, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for closing cor. secs. 20 and 21, marked C C T 28 S R 3 W on S., S 21 on E., and S 20 on W. face, with 4 grooves on E. and 2 grooves on W. face, from which:</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A hemlock, 6 ins. diam., bears S.48*E., 111 lks.dist. marked T 28 S R 3 W S 21 B T.</p> <p style="padding-left: 40px;">A hemlock, 6 ins. diam., bears S.20*W., 85 lks dist.</p>
