CHAINS	
18.30	Creek, 12 lks. wide, flows SW., ascend S. slope.
40.00	Set fir stake, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for 1/4 sec. cor., marked 1/4 S 30 on W. and 29 on E. face, from which: A fir, 20 ins. diam., bears S.80*W., 15 lks dist. marked 1/4 S 30 B T. A fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.48*E., 50 lks. dist. marked 1/4 S 29 B T.
65.60	Top of ridge, bears NE. and SW., descend NW. slope.
80.00	Set fir stake, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for cor. secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30, marked T 28 S S 20 on NE., R 3 W S 29 on SE., S 30 on SW. and S 19 on NW. face, with 2 notches on S. and 5 notches on E. edge, from which: A laurel, 12 ins. diam., bears N.6*E., 110 lks. dist. marked T 28 S R 3 W S 20 B T. A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S.13*E., 46 lks dist. marked T 28 S R 3 W S 29 B T. A fir, 8 ins. diam., bears S. 47*W., 150 lks dist. marked T 28 S R 3 W S 30 B T. A fir, 12 ins. diam., bears N.43*W., 34 lks. dist. marked T 28 S R 3 W S 19 B T.
	Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky- 4th rate. Timber, cedar, fir and hemlock. Underbrush, rhododendrons, and young firs. Land mountainous, covered with dense underbrush and heavily timbered and exceptionally difficult to survey.

40.00	Set temp. 1/4 sec. cor.
79.90	Intersect N. and S. line, 50 lks. S of cor. secs. 20, 21, 28 and 29.
