CHAINS	
	Thence I run South 89°39'W. on true line bet. secs. 20 and 29. Descend NW slope.
10.50	Creek, 3 lks. wide, flows NW., ascend NE slope.
14.50	Top of ridge, bears N. and S., descend W. slope.
27.00	Creek, 8 lks. wide, flows SW., ascend E. slope.
32.00	Top of ridge, bears N. and S., descend.
37.00	Creek, 10 lks. wide, flows SW., ascend E. slope.
39.95	Set fir stake, 3 ft. long, 4 ins. sq., 24 ins. in the ground for 1/4 sec. cor., marked 1/4 S 20 on N. and 29 on S. face, from which: A maple, 18 ins. diam., bears S.25°W., 42 lks. dist. Marked 1/4 S 29 B T. A fir, 60 ins. diam., bears N.88°E., 9 lks. dist. marked 1/4 S 20 B T.
60.00	Top of ridge, bears N. and S., ascend SW. slope.
61.90	Ravine, bears S., ascend SE. slope.
74.00	Top of ridge, bears N. and S., descend W. slope.
79.90	Cor. secs. 19, 20, 29 and 30. Land, mountainous. Soil, rocky- 4th rate. Timber, cedar, fir and hemlock. Underbrush, rhododendrons, vine maple, young firs and cedars. Land, mountainous; covered with dense underbrush and heavily timbered and exceptionally difficult to survey.
	Thence I run North 4°W. on random line bet. secs. 19 and 20.
40.00	Set temp. 1/4 sec. cor.
75.64	Intersect E. and W. line, 66 lks. N.89°41'E. of cor. secs. 17, 18, 19 and 20, which is a stake greatly decayed, marked and witnessed as described by the Surveyor General.
