	<p>A boulder, 4 feet above ground, marked X, bears N.46*E., 250 lks. dist.</p> <p>A boulder, 5 feet over, marked X, bears S.45*W., 410 lks. dist.</p> <p>Placed around the stake a pile of stones. No trees in reasonable distance.</p> <p>This corner is on the summit of ridge about $\frac{1}{4}$ of a mile from highest point of Dodson mountains. This mile is principally open Oak ridges, good grazing, but rocky and broken.</p> <p>Timber, Oak, Pine, Fir and Laurel.</p>	
	<p>East on Random between secs. 24 and 25. Va. $18\frac{1}{2}$*E.</p>	
40.00	Set temporary $\frac{1}{2}$ sec. post, and at	
79.56	Intersect East boundary 60 lks. South of corner.	
	Run S.89*34*W., on true line between secs. 24 and 25.	
18.06	A spring branch, 4 lks. wide, Course S. Va. $18\frac{1}{2}$ *E.

	<p>A large stone 6 feet out of 3.00 E. on line.</p> <p>A boulder, 4 feet above ground S.33*E., 440 lks. dist.</p>	
	No trees reasonably near the corner.	
52.26	A spring branch, 1 lk. wide, Course S.	
64.56	A creek, 2 lks. wide, Course SE.	
76.56	A boulder on line, 6 feet above ground.	
79.56	Corner to secs. 23, 24, 25 and 26.	
	<p>West half of this mile is open ridges, land, second rate, good grazing. East half is broken ridges and canyons.</p> <p>Timber, scattering Oak, Pine, Fir, and Laurel.</p>	
	July 19, 1871.	
	<p>North on line between secs. 23 and 24. Va. 19*E.</p>	
22.00	Reach height of land. Enter timber.	
31.00	Rocky point of Dodson mountain. Summit is East of us.	
40.00	Set post to $\frac{1}{4}$ sec. corner (on steep rocky hill sloping West, heavy Fir timber).	
	<p>A Fir, 8 ins. diam., bears N.85*W., 18 lks. dist.</p> <p>A Fir, 18 ins. diam., bears N.25*E., 16 lks. dist.</p>	
	North course through heavy timber descending the mountain.	
80.00	Set post to corner of secs. 13, 14, 23 and 24, from which
